LAND AND CLIMATE

This chapter is concerned with the land and climate in Taiwan Area. The information on land is obtained from data compiled by the Land Administration Department, the Ministry of the Interior and the Council of Agriculture, Executive Yuan. Please refer to the *Statistical Yearbook of Interior* and the *Agricultural Statistics Yearbook* for details. The information on climate is obtained from data collected by the weather observatories of the Central Weather Bureau located all over Taiwan Area and published in the *Statistical Abstract of Transportation and Communications* by the Department of Statistics Ministry of Transportation and Communications are the same as those reported by the Central Weather Bureau .

The size of territory of the Republic of China (Taiwan) is approximately 36,000 square kilometers. It comprises the main island of Taiwan (Taiwan Proper), the archipelagoes of Penghu, Kinmen and Matsu, as well as a number of other islands.

Taiwan proper is part of the arc that lies closest to the continent and marks the edge of the Asiatic continental shelf. Measuring nearly 400 kilometers from north to south and around 145 kilometers from east to west at its widest, it constitutes 99 percent of the area under the nation's jurisdiction. The Central Mountain Range slopes gently to a broad and fertile plain in the west. In the east, the mountains descend precipitously to the Pacific. The island's uplands are so extensive that only about one-fifth of Taiwan is arable. Shorelines are fairly straight and there are few good natural harbors. Rivers are short and useful for power generation, but not for navigation. Taiwan proper can be divided into five major physiographical regions: mountain ranges, volcanic mountains, foothills, tablelands, and coastal plains and basins.

The cultivated land refers to land under temporary and permanent crops, and can be classified into paddy field, and upland field of registered land, nonregistered land, river alluvial land, tidal land, slope land, and virgin field. Before 1995, data of forest land area is obtained from an aerial survey from 1973 to 1977 while data of 1995 was from survey from 1984 to 1993.

The Central Weather Bureau distinctively takes the responsibility for meteorological, seismological, and related marine and astronomical operations of the nation. Taiwan's climate is subtropical but pleasant. Recently, the average temperature is between 11°C (51.8°F) and 26°C (78.8°F). Summer runs from May to October, and a mild winter from December to February. Local and seasonal variations are numerous. The north is often rainy in the winter and the south in the summer. Snow is rare and falls only on the higher mountains.

POPULATION AND HOUSING

This chapter is concerned with population and housing. On the front of population, it contains information on population growth as well as the current status and projections of population. The population projections are obtained from the *Population Projections for R.O.C.: 2012 to 2060* prepared by the Manpower Planning Department of Council for Economic Planning and Development, Executive Yuan. Other population statistics come from the *Demographic Fact Book*, the *Monthly Bulletin of Interior Statistics*, and the *Statistical Yearbook of Interior*, published by the Ministry of the Interior. Data on living standards of households are obtained from the *Report on the Survey of Family Income and Expenditure*, published by the Directorate-General of Budget, Accounting and Statistics, Executive Yuan.

The population statistics mainly come from the household registration. According to the provisions of laws and regulations, the registered population refers to all of the R.O.C. nationals maintaining household registration in Taiwan-Fukien Area. The demographic data can be divided into two kinds, i.e., year-end static population data and year-round dynamic population data. The static data are defined as those collected during a particular reference period of time; those collected by continuous registration are called dynamic data. Thus, the former includes such population data as household, age-sex composition, education, marital status, and population density; the latter comprises data of birth, death, marriage, divorce and migration. All of the static population data are conducted from the outcome of household registration. The standard day of the statistics is on December 31. All of the dynamic data are calculated in accordance with the records of the application forms of those vital events. The standard period of the statistics is from January 1 to December 31 in the year.

The population projection, designed to provide data required by the government in drawing up its national economic plans as well as in formulating its policies, adopts the cohort-component approach by which moving projection is calculated separately for each age group with a compute program derived from one used by the U.S. Census Bureau in its projection of population for a specific age.

Fertility Rates -- Four kinds of fertility rates are presented in this section, i.e., general fertility rate, total fertility rate, gross reproduction rate, and net reproduction rate. The general fertility rate refers to the number of live births per thousand of mid-year childbearing age women (aged 15 to 49). The total fertility rate refers to the birth rate derived from the total number of births likely to come out from the current generation of childbearing age women during their childbearing period without death. The gross reproduction rate refers to the number of live female infants given by every 1,000 childbearing age women

during their childbearing period. The net reproduction rate refers to the number of live female infants given by every 1,000 childbearing women surviving during their childbearing period.

MANPOWER

This chapter is concerned with labor force, employment, labor productivity, occupational injuries, labor disputes and labor unions. The first three kinds of data are mainly obtained from the results produced by the manpower resource survey and the employees' earnings survey regularly conducted by the Directorate-General of Budget, Accounting and Statistics, Executive Yuan, which are incorporated in the *Yearbook of Manpower Survey Statistics*, the *Monthly Bulletin of Manpower Statistics*, the *Yearbook of Earnings and Productivity Statistics*, and the *Monthly Bulletin of Earnings and Productivity Statistics*. Data on occupational injuries, labor disputes and labor unions come from the official statistics compiled by the Council of Labor Affairs (CLA) and incorporated in the *Yearbook of Labor Statistic* published by CLA.

The manpower resource survey, conducted once a month, and the week containing the fifteenth day of a month is set as the reference week. The survey covers all the population of age 15 or over who are engaged in economic activities in Taiwan Area (Kinmen County and Lienchiang County excluded), but excludes those in active military services and in prison. Everyone is classified into only one of the following three slots; employment, unemployment, or not in labor force. Where a person in employment has more than one job, the job occupying the longest working time in the reference week is counted as his job. The survey adopts the two-stage stratified sampling method with the basic administration unit of Tsun or Li as the first stage sampling unit and the household as the second stage sampling unit.

In the employees' earnings survey, unless otherwise specified, the number of employees on payroll at the end of a month is collected while earning, working hours and turnover of employees at the end of each month during a year. The employees' earnings, working hours, accession and separation are monthly data multiply the number of employees of the month. Then calculate the 12-month weighted average. The object of this survey are public and private firms and their employees in Taiwan Area (Kinmen County and Lienchiang County excluded), excluding the factories owned by the Ministry of National Defense, consumers cooperatives, workshops of schools, relief institutions and prisons. In the survey period, if a surveyed worker has two jobs, these two jobs will both be counted, a way different from that for the manpower resource survey. The survey adopts both of the complete investigation approach and the cut-off stratified random sampling approach which uses the Dalenius-Hodges approximate optimum method for stratum division and the Neyman optimum Allocation for allocation of samples in each stratum. The survey is conducted in accordance with the 8th revision of Standard Industrial Classification of the Republic of China.

Labor force -- It is defined as those civilians who, during the reference week, are 15 years of age or over and who are available to work, including both the employed and the unemployed. The employed population comprise all the persons who, during the reference week, work for pay or work for 15 hours or more as unpaid family workers. The unemployed population comprise all the persons who, during the reference week, are 15 years of age or over and under the following conditions: (1) jobless, (2) available to work, (3) seeking a job or waiting for results after job seeking. Besides, the unemployed population also includes the persons who are waiting to recall or start a new job but not working and paid yet.

Not in Labor Force -- The category comprises those civilians who during the reference week are 15 years or over and not in labor force, including the persons who intend to work but not seeking for , attending schools, being engaged in housekeeping, aged, disabled, or with some other reasons so that unemployed and not seeking for a job.

Number of Employees -- The employees refer to those on payroll at the end of a month, including full-time and part-time workers, permanent workers, temporary workers under projects, contract workers, students working under cooperation programs between industries and schools (excluding those who do not work for a full month), and apprentices with pay. Also included those who are temporarily on leave, such as going abroad on official trip, training, transfer, military training, education, illness, vacation, marriage, and child delivery. However, excluded are: (1) employers participating the operation without pay, own-account workers, and unpaid family workers, (2) members of boards of directors, supervisors and advisors not actually participating the operation, (3) those drafted for military service with partial pay, without participating in operation for the entire month, (4) contracted workers outside the factories and paid by piece of work.

Earnings of Employees -- The earnings of an employee are composed of the following three categories: (1) Regular earnings: It refers to regular rewards paid to employees every month. Included in the regular earnings are basic pay, regular allowance and awards such as housing allowance, transportation allowance, free meals, free water and electricity, regularly (production, good job-rating, good sales, etc.) performance awards, full attendance award, etc. Pay in kind should be converted into value at the current prices. The regular earnings should include payable income tax, insurance premium and labor union fees. (2) Over time pay: it refers to the rewards paid for employees working overtime. (3) Other irregular earnings: Included are performance awards, full attendance award, year-end bonus, bonus for Dragon Festival and/or other festivals, official trip per diems, and job transfer allowance.

Productivity -- The productivity data can be classified into labor productivity, capital productivity, and multi-factor productivity. This chapter includes only the labor productivity measured by value of output which is specifically defined as the real value of output produced by an employee within a unit of time. It is derived by dividing the total input into the total output. The real gross domestic product (GDP) as shown in the national income product account (NIPA) is the output while the working hours of an employee, derived jointly from the manpower resource survey and the employees' earnings survey, are the input. Information and compilation methods for labor productivity measured by quantum of output and multi-factor productivity, please see the *Trends in Labor Productivity* and the *Trends in Multi-factor Productivity* all published by the Directorate-General of Budget, Accounting and Statistics, Executive Yuan.

Labor Union -- The number of labor unions refers to the total of labor union federation, industrial labor unions, and trade (occupational labor) unions. The industrial labor union refers to a union organized within an industry and composed of workers of different occupations. The trade union refers to a labor union organized by workers of a specific occupation. The labor union federation refers to an organization formed by several industrial labor unions and/or trade unions. For information on operation and activities of labor unions, please refer to the *Yearbook of Labor Statistics* published by the Council of Labor Affairs.

EDUCATION, SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY, CULTURE AND MASS COMMUNICATION

This chapter is concerned with information on education, science & technology, culture, and mass communication in our country. On the front of education, it contains data on the status of education at various stages, net percentage of graduates entering advanced levels, opportunity for graduates entering advanced levels, educational attainments, and educational expenditure. All of the educational statistics are obtained from the *Educational Statistics* and the *Education Statistical Indicators*, both compiled by the Ministry of Education based on statistical reports regularly submitted by all of the public and private schools, except for information on educational attainments which come from the official statistics of the Ministry of the Interior. On the front of science and technology, this chapter contains data on national research and development (R&D) expenditures, publication of scientific and technical (S&T) papers and number of patents granted. Information on R&D expenditures and publication of (S&T) papers are obtained from the *Indicators of Science and Technology*, compiled from results of the Annual National Technology survey conducted by the National Science Council, Executive Yuan. On the front of culture, this chapter contains data on the status of libraries and the status of historic relics. Information on culture is obtained from official statistics compiled by the Ministry of Education and the Ministry of Culture, respectively. On the front of mass communication, this chapter introduces the status of mass communication enterprises and the saturation rates for newspapers and magazines. The information on mass communication enterprises come from official statistics produced by the Ministry of Finance while that on newspapers and magazines, from the *Report on the Survey of Family Income and Expenditure* published by the Directorate-General of Budget, Accounting and Statistics, Executive Yuan.

The Annual National Technology Survey takes place once a year. Objects of the survey are all of the organizations engaging in research in the fields of natural sciences, engineering, medical sciences, agricultural sciences, humanities and social sciences, including departments and institutes of all public and private colleges and universities, independent research institutes, and public and private industries. For investigation, private industries are drawn by the stratified sampling method, and the data are used as a base to estimate the population of each related parameter by ratio estimation. For all other kinds, every object is investigated in the survey, and the data obtained from this part are directly compiled and tabulated in the statistical tables without going through any estimation process. The survey adopts the calendar year as the survey period.

School Year -- A school year begins August 1 of a year to July 31 of the next year. Each school year is divided into two semesters, with the first semester being from August 1 of a year to January 31 of the next year and the second semester, from February 1 to July 31 of the next year.

Education at All Levels -- Education can be classified into following five stages: preschool education (preceding the first level), primary education (first level), secondary education (second level), higher education (third level), and social education (special and other levels). The preschool education is offered to toddlers (age 3 to 5) at the kindergartens. The primary education is offered to students (age 6 to 11) at the elementary schools. The secondary education is offered to students (age 12 to 17) at the junior high, senior high, and vocational senior schools (including the first three years of the 5-year junior colleges). The higher education is offered to students (age 18 to 21) at the colleges/universities and above (excluding the first three year of the 5-year junior colleges).

Opportunity for graduates entering advanced levels -- This refers to the chance for a school graduate to enroll in a school the next higher level. For instance, the opportunity for a junior high school graduate entering advanced levels is the first-year students at the senior high schools, vocational senior schools (including supplementary schools and prolonged education classes), and 5-year junior colleges as a percentage of total graduates coming out of all junior high schools in the current year.

Education Attainments -- This refers to the highest school education received or the highest qualification test passed or the best knowledge gained from informal schools, at home and overseas, by a person of age 25 or above at the benchmark date. An informal school may be a tutorial class, unregistered college, correspondence course program (school), symposium, training class, supplementary education class, seminars, and self-study.

To facilitate comparison with international statistics, the indicators have presented R&D expenditures and personnel since 2001, which are classified according to the definitions in the newest edition of the OECD's R&D manual "Frascati Manual". In the OECD criterion, only persons with university degree or above are counted as "researchers". Those with lower formal qualifications are counted as "technicians."

Scientific and Technical Paper -- This refers to the papers produced in the process of the scientific and technological activities, including referee papers, conference papers and monographs. The research reports published yet never in any academic journals and the dissertations of doctors or masters are excluded from the statistics.

HEALTH

This chapter is concerned with information on public health in our country. It contains data on medical care facilities, health personnel, causes of death, nutrient consumption and health services. Data on medical care facilities, health personnel, health services and death rates of the leading causes, infant and maternity are obtained from the website of the Department of Health, Executive Yuan. Data on nutrient supply are obtained from the *Agricultural Statistics Yearbook* published by the Council of Agriculture, Executive Yuan.

The scope of data on medical care facilities covered public and private medical care institutions.

The classification standards of major causes of death are based on the tenth revision of the *International Statistical Classification of Diseases and Related Health Problems* (ICD) by the World Health Organization.

The hospital beds include acute beds, chronic beds, psychiatric beds and special beds.

The nutrient supply is derived from the nutrients contained in the foods taken each day by each person.

ENVIRONMENT

This chapter includes information on air pollution, pollution of rivers, environmental noise monitoring, clearance of municipal solid waste, budget of environmental agencies, pollution inspection and administrative penalty, and water withdrawal. Data on environment come from the official statistics contained in the *Yearbook of Environmental Protection Statistics* published by the Environmental Protection Administration, Executive Yuan. Data on natural protected area and water withdrawal are from the Council of Agriculture, Executive Yuan and Water Resources Agency, Ministry of Economic Affairs respectively.

Pollutants Standard Index (PSI) -- The procedure to calculate the PSI is as follows: First, each of the air pollutants -- including suspended particulate with a diameter less than $10\mu\text{m}$, sulfur dioxide density, nitrogen dioxide density, carbon monoxide density, and ozone density -- monitored in the air by one of the 57 monitoring stations scattered in Taiwan Area is converted to the PSI sub-index value. JUSTICE AND PUBLIC SAFETY

This chapter is concerned with information on status and treatment of crimes, traffic accidents, and fire accidents. Data on status of crimes and traffic accidents are obtained from the official statistics contained in the *Statistics Annual Report of Police Affairs*, an annual report published by the National Police Agency, the Ministry of the Interior. Data on fire accidents come from the National Fire Agency, the Ministry of the Interior. Data on treatment of crimes mainly come from the official statistics compiled by the Ministry of Justice and the Judicial Yuan, contained in the *Statistical Handbook*, an annual report published by the Statistical Department, the Ministry of Justice.

Data on the status of crimes include criminal cases, cleared cases, and the number of offenders. A criminal case refers to a case in which one is found offending against the criminal codes, indicted and punished according to the Criminal Suit Law. Statistics on criminal cases are reported by the police agencies regarding complaints or accusations filed by ordinary persons or crimes found by policemen while on duty, with the figure for a specific period. The number of cleared cases refers to the criminal cases which, after investigation, are cleared by police in a specific period. Statistics on offenders refer to the number of criminal suspects who are implicated and after being revised, the monthly statistics are compiled into an annual report at the end of a year.

The treatment of crimes refers to investigation, trial and execution of court sentence as regard to crimes according to the Criminal Suit Law, the Juvenile Delinquency Treatment Law, and related laws. For a crime, a prosecutor shall conduct investigation in accordance with law and indict a suspect if the evidences obtained from his investigation are sufficient to prove the suspect guilty. After court trials, if the suspect is found guilty and convicted, he will be sent to the public prosecutor's offices of the courts for execution of punishment.

Violent Crime -- It principally refers to murder and nonnegligent manslaughter, serious intimidation, robbery and forceful taking, kidnapping, serious injury and forcible rape (gang rape).

Theft -- It refers to stealing of automobiles, motorcycles and other properties .

Offender Rate -- It refers to the number of offenders per 100 000 of mid-year population. Offenders are divided to 4 categories according to their age:

1. An adult offender -- refers to the offender who is of age 24 or more.
2. An adolescent offender -- refers to the offender who is of age 18 - 24.
3. A juvenile offender -- refers to the offender who is of age 12 - 17.
4. A child offender -- refers to the offender who is of age less than 12.

Fatal Traffic Accident -- It refers to a major, heavily wounded traffic accident. The death toll refers to the number of deaths instantly caused by the accident and deaths occurring within 24 hours following the accident.

SOCIAL WELFARE

This chapter is concerned with statistics on social insurance, social assistance and relief, low income households, social welfare services, and social welfare expenditure. For social insurance, the data of Government Employees' and School Staffs' Insurance, and Retired Government Employees' Insurance are obtained from the *Statistical Data for Government Employee and School Staff Insurance*, published by Bank of Taiwan. Data on Labor Insurance and Farmers' Health Insurance come from the *Yearbook of Labor Insurance Statistics*, published by the Bureau of Labor Insurance. Statistics on National Health Insurance are obtained from the *National Health Insurance Annual Statistical Report*, published by the Bureau of National Health Insurance. Statistics on social welfare expenditure are obtained from the *Yearbook of Financial Statistics*, published by the Department of Statistics, Ministry of Finance. All other information comes from the *Monthly Bulletin of Interior Statistics*, and the *Statistical Yearbook of Interior*, published by the Department of Statistics, Ministry of the Interior.

Social welfare statistics are compiled by the Ministry of Interior from monthly and quarterly reports regularly submitted by Municipal Governments. As it is hard to secure data concerning private social relief institutions, readers shall pay attention to revisions to data of the previous year.

Social Insurance -- It shall cover National Health Insurance, Government Employees' and School Staffs' Insurance, Retired Government Employees' Insurance, Labor Insurance, Farmers' Health Insurance and Employment Insurance.

Low Income Household -- Before FY1998, the criteria for a low income household were set by the provincial (or) municipal government every year on the basis of the minimum of subsistence required for each locality. In Taiwan Province and Kaohsiung Municipality, the minimum of subsistence were fixed at the level no more than one-third of monthly average income per capita for the previous year. In Taipei Municipality, the cut point was set at a level no more than 40 percent of the current expenditure derived from the survey on household income and expenditure for the previous year. After FY1999, the minimum of subsistence is computed by the central and municipal competent authorities as 60% of the per capita nonproductive expenditure of the latest year announced by the central department of budget, accounting and statistics.

Net Expenditure for Social Welfare -- The expenditure is compiled on a basis of fiscal year and it is net of the double counting arising from inter-governmental transfers. The social welfare expenditure covered social insurance (including expenditures for pension and survivors' benefits), social relief, benefit service, nationwide employment service, medical care and community development, and environmental protection before FY1989. Since FY1990, it excluded expenditure on community development, environmental protection and expenditures for pension and survivors' benefits. Data from FY1981 to 1989 are recalculated by the definition of the social welfare expenditure made in 1990.

NATIONAL ECONOMICS

This chapter is concerned with information on national income, family income and expenditure and industrial inter-relations, all coming from the Directorate-General of Budget, Accounting and Statistics, Executive Yuan. Statistics for national income and industrial inter-relations, compiled based on the principles set by the United Nations, are incorporated in the *National Accounts Yearbook* and the *Report on 2006 Input-Output Tables*. Data on family income and expenditure, derived from the family income and expenditure survey, are contained in the *Report on the Survey of Family Income and Expenditure*.

In 1953, our country began compiling annual national income statistics in Taiwan area, based on the system of national accounts by the United Nations. Preliminary Compilation of quarterly national product and income statistics started in 1970. Beginning in 1978, a macro-econometric model has been used to forecast economic conditions for the current quarter. The forecasts together with the preliminary statistics for the previous quarter are compiled into the *Quarterly National Economic Trends* published in every February, May, August, and November of a year. In 1986, the prediction was extended to cover a quarter beyond the current one, an additional quarter in 1987, and four quarters to come in 1988. Our country adopted the UN national economic account system, as revised by the United Nations in 1993, and compiled national income statistics in November 2005. Data have been revised and released every 5 years, for years ending in "4" and "9", according to system of national accounts, sourcing from Industrial and Commercial Census, etc. Industrial classification has been revised, according to the eighth edition of *Standard Industrial Classification of the Republic of China*, and related date have been traced back to 1981.

This country started preparation of statistics on personal income distribution in 1964, a sampling survey on household income and expenditure in the Taiwan area. This survey adopts a stratified two-stage sampling method with counties and cities as subpopulations. The Ts'un and Li, a basic administrative unit, is designated as the primary sampling unit (PSU), and the household in the PSU is the secondary sampling unit (SSU). The universal sampling rate is about 0.20%, which is about 15,857 households.

The objects of the family income and expenditure sampling survey are R.O.C. nationals dwelling in Taiwan area and the families these R.O.C. nationals have organized to live together economically. Interview and bookkeeping are both adopted in the survey. The survey uses the stratified two-stage sampling method to draw out families for interview, some of which are again drawn to do bookkeeping. Data for dynamic changes are based on cumulation for the entire year while static data, at the end of the survey year. Its history can be divided into 15 stages as follows:

Stage 1 (1964-1970): During the period, the survey was conducted every other year, and the ratio of samples drawn -- samples as a share of total households-raise in the range from 0.13% to 0.16%.

Stage 2 (1972-1974): The frequency of the survey was changed to once every year, and the ratio of samples drawn was raised to 0.18%.

Stage 3 (1975-1977): The survey was undertaken annually, and the ratio of samples drawn was raised to 0.3%.

Stage 4 (1978-1983): The survey was undertaken annually, and the ratio of samples drawn was raised to 0.4%.

Stage 5 (1984-1994): The survey was undertaken annually, and the numbers of samples drawn has been fixed at 16,434 households.

Stage 6 (Since 1995): The survey was undertaken annually, and the numbers of samples drawn has been fixed at 14,706 households.

Stage 7 (Since 1996): The survey was undertaken annually, and the numbers of samples drawn has been fixed at 13,702 households.

Stage 8 (Since 1997): The survey was undertaken annually, and the numbers of samples drawn has been fixed at 13,701 households.

Stage 9 (Since 1998): The survey was undertaken annually, and the numbers of samples drawn has been fixed at 14,031 households.

Stage 10 (1999-2000): The survey was undertaken annually, and the numbers of samples drawn has been fixed at 13,801 households.

Stage 11 (Since 2001): The survey was undertaken annually, and the numbers of samples drawn has been fixed at 13,601 households.

Stage 12 (2002-2005): The survey was undertaken annually, and the numbers of samples drawn has been fixed at 13,681 households.

Stage 13 (Since 2006): The survey was undertaken annually, and the numbers of samples drawn has been fixed at 13,776 households.

Stage 14 (Since 2010): The survey was undertaken annually, and the numbers of samples drawn has been fixed at 14,853 households.

Stage 15 (Since 2011): The survey was undertaken annually, and the numbers of samples drawn has been fixed at 15,857 households.

In our country, the Input-Output tables had been compiled for the first time in 1960. The first table for 1954 was built by Professor Hsing Mu-huan. The second table for 1955 was compiled by the Joint Commission on Rural Reconstruction, which has been reorganized to the present Council of Agriculture. Subsequently, the Council for International Economic Cooperation and Development, which has been reorganized to the present Council for Economic Planning and Development, compiled the eight tables for 1961, 1964, 1966, 1969, 1971, 1974, 1976, and 1979. The Directorate-General of Budget, Accounting and Statistics took over the job in 1982, preparing the tables for 1981, 1984, 1986, 1989, 1991, 1994, 1996, 1999, 2001, 2004 and 2006. The Input-Output tables for 2006 is composed of tables for purchasers' trading price, producers' trading prices, input coefficients, impact coefficients, trading of domestic manufactured products, and trading of import products. Besides the benchmark Input-Output tables (commodity by commodity) compiled every 5 years, the annual Input-Output table (commodity by industry) had been compiled every year since 2010. Results will be released in every December of a year following the data year, and the revision for the previous one will be released together.

BUSINESS ACTIVITIES

This chapter is concerned with statistical information on business activities, including data on profit-seeking enterprises , new corporations registration, business entities existing registration, small and medium enterprises. All of the information except for profit-seeking enterprises is obtained from the *Economic Statistics Annual*, published by the Department of Statistics, Ministry of Economic Affairs. As for the profit-seeking enterprises, the information is contained in the *Monthly Statistics of Finance*, published by the Department of Statistics, Ministry of Finance.

A profit-seeking enterprise means the business owned by the private sector, government or jointly owned by both and managed in the manner of sole proprietorship, partnership or company organization for profit. And the related data are based on the tax declaration forms filled by taxpayers.

A small and medium enterprise refers to an enterprise that has completed company registration or business registration in accordance which the requirements of the law, and which conforms to the following criteria:

1. In the manufacturing, construction, mining and quarrying industries, a paid-in capital of NT\$80 million (US\$2.42 million) or less.
2. In the agriculture, forestry and fisheries, water, electricity and gas, commercial, transportation, warehousing and communications, finance, insurance and real estate, industrial and commercial services or social and personal services industries, sales revenue of NT\$100 million (US\$3.03 million) or less in the last year.

AGRICULTURE, FORESTRY AND FISHING

This chapter is concerned with information on agriculture, forestry, fisheries, and livestock husbandry. All data on agriculture, forestry and fishing are obtained from the *Agricultural Statistics Yearbook*, the *Fisheries Statistical Yearbook*, and the *Food Supply and Utilization Yearbook* all published by Council of Agriculture, Executive Yuan. Data on agricultural employees are from the *Yearbook of Manpower Survey Statistics*, published by Directorate-General of Budget, Accounting and Statistics, Executive Yuan.

The scope of agricultural production reporting system cover all agricultural products produced in Taiwan Area except sheep, horses and deer. Production does not include intermediate inputs, consumption or waste. The productions of principal products are all reported. For by-products only productions of forestry are reported. From the reported data, the Council of Agriculture picks out a number of representative products for calculation of the agricultural production index which adopts the Laspeyres fixed base weighted formula, with the weights being the prices of farm products prevailing in the base year. In shifting the base year, the Fisher Ideal formula are used to splice the new and old indices. To avoid double counting the agricultural output, seeds are deducted from the output of a crop in calculation of the output index for the crop. In calculation of the general agricultural production index, crop products used as animal feed are further deducted in order to avoid double counting of the animal feeds in the crop sector. Animal feeds are included in the livestock and fisheries production.

Fisheries -- This line of business can be divided into six categories, i.e., deep-sea fishery, offshore fishery, coastal fishery, marine culture, inland water fishing and inland water culture. The deep-sea fishery refers to fishing on waters beyond the economic zones of our country by means of powered vessels. The offshore fishery refers to fishing on the waters within the economic zones of our country, i.e., 12 knotical miles to 200 knotical miles from the coast by means of powered vessels. The coastal fishery refers to fishing on the territorial waters, i.e., 12 knotical miles from the coast, by fishing raft or other means. The marine culture refers to raising aquatic animals or plants in the waters along the coast. The inland water fishing refers to fishing or harvesting of aquatic animals or plants in inland waters. The inland water culture refers to raising aquatic animals or plants in inland waters.

INDUSTRY

This chapter is concerned with statistical data on industries and energy. Data on industrial production and industrial production indices are obtained from statistical results of the monthly industrial production, shipment and inventory survey issued in the *Yearbook of Industrial Production Statistics* published by the Department of Statistics, Ministry of Economic Affairs. Statistics on energy demand and supply mainly come from the official statistics printed in the yearbook of *Taiwan Energy Statistics* published by the Bureau of Energy, the Ministry of Economic Affairs. Data on construction of building are excerpted from the *Statistical Yearbook of Construction and Planning* published by the Ministry of the Interior.

The industrial production, shipment and inventory survey is conducted once a month, and its scope covers the five industrial sectors in Taiwan area, i.e. mining and quarrying, manufacturing, electricity & gas supply, water supply and building construction industries. Objects of the survey are enterprises selected from the *Factory Registration Update Survey*. Different sampling sizes are applied to different industries. Mining and quarrying, water supply, building construction and public enterprises sectors are all subject to survey. Other sectors are partly selected as samples for survey by way of “cut-off sampling”. Samples covered by the survey totaled 8,000 enterprises, accounting for 10.6% of the population (or 15.5% of the population excluding firms having employees less than 5 people). Different objects are subject to different survey methods. The data source of mining and quarrying major division is from the Bureau of Mines, Ministry of Economic Affairs. The building construction major division uses the data of “total floor area of occupancy permit” published by Construction and Planning Agency Ministry of the Interior. Public and private enterprises as well as business operators of electricity & gas supply and water supply are required to fill out the survey questionnaires by themselves. The Department of Statistics, Ministry of Economic Affairs is also designated to communicate with surveyed factories and ensure their reporting in time. In addition, the auxiliary methods are Internet submitting and double-checking over the completed forms by on-the-spot specialists. This survey has secured a response rate over 95%. The industrial production index is calculated by Laspeyres formula and from the production weighted by unit net value of selected products; the net values are obtained from the *Factory Registration Update Survey* conducted in 2005.

On the front of energy statistics, the data has been compiled according to the new format Energy Balances. The heating value of electricity is based on the average efficiency of thermal power. Some international organizations, however, have set 860 Kcal/KWh as the heating value of electricity consumption. A companion volume, the *Energy Balances in Taiwan, Republic of China*, presents energy data in comprehensive balances on the same heating value basis for the purpose of international comparison.

TRANSPORTATION, STORAGE AND COMMUNICATIONS

This chapter is concerned with statistical data on sea transportation, inland transportation, air transportation, postal services, communications, and tourism. All of the information except for tourism is obtained from official registration data, which are incorporated in the *Statistical Abstract of Transportation and Communications* published by the Department of Statistics, Ministry of Transportation and Communications. On the front of tourism, information on visitor arrivals by nationality and outbound departures of nationals of the Republic of China, contained in the *Report on Tourism Statistics* published by the Tourism Bureau, is obtained from the entry and exit records kept by the National Immigration Agency, Ministry of Interior. Visitor arrivals by length of stay and visitor expenditure in Taiwan from the *Report on Tourists' Consumption and Activities Survey* published by the Tourism Bureau.

The tourists' consumption and activities survey is conducted once a year. Objective of the survey are foreign nationals or overseas Chinese coming to Taiwan for visits, excluding those staying in Taiwan for less than 24 hours and those staying for over 60 days. The survey adopts the "quota sampling" method to draw an effective sample of 6,009 tourists receiving interview at the check-in counters of Taiwan Taoyuan International Airport, Taipei Songshan Airport and Kaohsiung International Airport.

Passenger-Kilometer (or Ton-Kilometer) -- The passenger-kilometer, a unit used to measure the passenger transportation volume, refers to carrying a passenger for a distance of one kilometer. The number of passengers refers to the number of persons buying tickets, excluding the passengers exempt from transportation service charges. The distance of transportation is the one stated on the ticket. Therefore, the passenger transportation volume can be derived from the number of passengers multiplied by the distance of transportation. The ton-kilometer, a unit used to measure the volume of freight transportation, refers to carrying a ton of freight for a distance of one kilometer. The freight excludes mail, personal luggage, and fuel. The volume of freight is based on the amount and the distance stated on the invoice, and the volume of freight transportation can be derived from the weight of freight multiplied by the distance of transportation.

Number of Motor Vehicles -- The motor vehicles refer to those registered with and licensed by the vehicle administration agencies, excluding military vehicles, tricars, 3-wheel motor trucks, and motor vehicles without license plate or with temporary license plate. In March 1987, the motor vehicles further excluded those license plates having expired. Commercial vehicles include buses, trucks, pick-up truck. Specially constructed vehicles, which are installed with special equipment to serve special purposes, include towing vehicles, ambulances, fire engines, armored police vehicles, and police patrol cars.

FINANCE AND INSURANCE

This chapter is concerned with all sorts of financial statistics, international balance of payments and insurance data. All of the information except for insurance is obtained from the *Financial Statistics Monthly*, published by the Central Bank. As for the insurance, the information is obtained from the website of the Taiwan Insurance Institute.

The domestic financial institutions refer to financial service institutions organized and registered in accordance with the Banking Act or other decrees. The financial statistics at present classify Financial Institutions as Monetary Financial Institutions, Trust and Investment Companies, and Life Insurance Companies. Monetary Financial Institutions are grouped according to whether they are able to create money. The Monetary Financial Institutions include the Central Bank, Domestic Banks (including medium business banks), local branches of foreign and Mainland Chinese banks, credit cooperative associations, credit departments of Farmers' and Fishermen's Associations, Chunghwa Post Co, and money market mutual funds. In compilation of financial statistics, property and casualty insurance companies, bills finance companies, and securities finance companies are not considered a part of the financial institutions sector because the liability instruments they offer are significantly different from those offered by financial institutions. Instead, they are viewed as a part of the private enterprises sector.

Stock price index, compiled by the Taiwan Stock Exchange, is a weighted annual index using 1966 as the base year. The index is based on the closing prices of selected issues, using amount issued as the weight and calculated by the Peyres formula. The annual average is derived from the number of total trading days in a year.

Currency held by the public -- This refers to currency held by all sectors/departments except Monetary Financial Institutions. Currency held by the public = Currency issued by the Central Bank – Cash in vaults of Monetary Financial Institutions.

Quasi-Money -- This refers to the time deposits (including general time deposits and negotiable certificates of deposit (NCDs)), time savings deposits, and foreign currency deposits of enterprises and individuals in other Monetary Financial Institutions. In addition, postal deposits are also included. From Jan. 1994 on, the data also include repurchase agreements and non-resident NT deposits. From Oct. 2004 on, the data also include money market mutual funds. The carrying values of the host contracts of structured products issued by banks are excluded.

Reserve Money -- The reserve money comprises all reserves held by other Monetary Financial Institutions and currency held by the public, both of which are monetary liabilities of the Central Bank. It is also referred to as “high-powered money” or “base money”. Changes in reserve money affect directly the amount of loanable funds of other Monetary Financial Institution. Through the money-creating process, money supply and liquidity expand or contract by a multiple which is usually measured by the ratio of monetary aggregate to reserve money.

Monetary Aggregate (M_{IB}) -- It is composed of currency held by the public and deposit money.

EXTERNAL TRADE

External trade, covering imports and exports in value, trade composition and trade indices, are compiled from the import and export declaration documents on a monthly basis, with the results incorporated in the *Monthly Statistics of Exports and Imports*, published by the Department of Statistics, Ministry of Finance.

Imports and exports statistics cover only cargoes exported to and imported from foreign countries; fish sales and bunker oil receipts at local ports have also been included in exports since 1970. Values of exports are priced on a free-on-board (F.O.B.) basis, and values of imports are priced on a cost-insurance-freight (C.I.F.) basis. Exported goods are classified according to the country of destination which was declared by the exporter. If there are more than one destination, the final destination shall be applied. Imported goods are classified according to the country of origin. Trade indices, compiled from a sample of 1,898 export items and 2,015 import items, can be classified into five categories and their formulas as follows:

$$1. \text{ Value index: } I_v = \frac{\sum p_i q_i}{\sum p_0 q_0} \times 100$$

where $\sum p_i q_i$ refers to the total value of export (import) commodities group in the current period, and $\sum p_0 q_0$ refers to that in the base period.

$$2. \text{ Unit value index : } I_p = \sqrt{\frac{\sum p_i q_i}{\sum p_0 q_0} \times \frac{\sum p_i q_i}{\sum p_0 q_i}} \times 100$$

where P_i refers to the unit value in the current period, P_0 refers to the unit value in the base period, q_i refers to the quantity in the current period, q_0 refers to the quantity in the base period, and $\sum p_i q_i$, $\sum p_0 q_0$ refer to the total sample values of commodities of the given group in the current period, the base period respectively.

$$3. \text{ Quantum index: } I_Q = I_v / I_p \times 100$$

$$4. \text{ Net terms of trade: } T_N = I_{PE} / I_{PI} \times 100$$

Where I_{PE} means the unit value index of export, I_{PI} means the unit value index of import.

$$5. \text{ Income terms of trade: } T_I = T_N \times I_{QE} / 100$$

Where I_{QE} means the quantum index of export.

REVENUES AND EXPENDITURES OF GOVERNMENT

This chapter is concerned with statistical data on the revenues and expenditures of general governments. The governments' net revenues and expenditures are based on an accrual basis. All of the data are obtained from the *Yearbook of Financial Statistics*, published by the Department of Statistics of the Ministry of Finance.

Net Revenues and Expenditures of General Governments -- Net revenues exclude the government bonds, borrowing and surplus of previous fiscal years. Net expenditures exclude the principal repayment.

The tax statistics of our country include direct taxes and indirect taxes. The direct taxes include income taxes, land taxes (agricultural land tax, land value tax, and land value increment tax), house tax, estate and gift taxes, security transactions tax, futures transactions tax, mining concession tax, education surtax, and deed tax. All other taxes are classified as indirect taxes.

PRICES

This chapter is concerned with data on price indices, including wholesale price index, consumer price index, import price index, and export price index. These four kinds of indices are compiled by the Directorate-General of Budget, Accounting and Statistics(DGBAS), Executive Yuan, using the intentional sampling method and calculated by the Laspeyres weighted aggregate formula. Results of the compilation are published in the *Price Statistics Monthly*.

The Wholesale price survey covers a scope limited only to the tradable goods at the processing stage (including materials, semi-finished goods, and finished goods) and importing commodities, excluding such non-tradable products as services, real estates, and securities. The commodities under investigation are picked based on the economic structure of Taiwan Area in the base year, updated once every five years, a practice applicable to all other price indices. The priced commodities include 1,123 items, 273 items for import prices, 275 items for export prices and 575 items for domestic wholesale prices. The price of domestic manufactured goods are surveyed by monthly mailing or internet reporting to designated companies except the prices of Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing goods are obtained from the digital transmission data dispatch by the Council of Agriculture , Executive Yuan and Taipei Agricultural Products Marketing corporation. The designated companies are required to report the actual selling prices of selected commodities with the same specification. (in principal, price after adjustment for rebate, tax, and shipment, etc.) around the 20th of a month. The prices of import and export goods are directly provided by the Import and Export Price Indices Survey conducted by the DGBAS.

The consumer price survey covers a scope of consumer goods and services purchased by ordinary families, excluding investment or savings goods such a financial assets and real estates. The priced items were selected based on the family consumption structure in the base year. During pricing period, the actual retail prices of the selected items are taken by investigators in 16 surveyed counties and cities. In the base year of 2006, a total of 424 items of commodities and services are selected. The date of pricing is determined by the feature of the priced items. For the eight surveyed cities, it may be priced nine times a month or three times a month. For the eight surveyed counties, it may be priced once a month or three times a month.

The import and export price survey covers a scope of commodities imported and exported. The priced items were picked based on the structure of imports and exports prevailing in the base year. The pricing is conducted by mail or through Internet Reporting System. Selected importers and exporters are required to report the actual transaction prices most close to the 20th day of a month. The export price is on a F.O.B. basis while the import, on a C.I.F. basis. For the base year of 2006, a total of 273 import categories items and 275 export categories items have been selected for pricing.

The price data contained in this chapter are not seasonally adjusted ones. For seasonally adjusted price statistics, please refer to the *Price Statistics Monthly*.

ADMINISTRATION

This chapter is concerned with information on civil service personnel, central and local public office elections and aids extended for foreign countries. Information on civil service personnel is obtained from the official statistics of the Ministry of Civil Service, contained in the *Statistical Yearbook of Civil Service*. Data on public office elections are compiled by the Central Election Commission and incorporated in the *Statistical Yearbook of Interior* published by the Ministry of the Interior. As for data on aids extended for foreign countries is from the International Cooperation Department, Ministry of Economic Affairs.

Civil Service Personnel -- They include all politically appointed officials and administrative officers filling in civil service positions given with specific titles, grades and steeds at executive agencies, public enterprises, public schools, and other organizations formed on accordance with laws. Also included in this category are elected chiefs of government offices and military officers filling in civil service positions.

Central Public Office Elections -- After our country put the Constitution into force, the first central public office elections took place in 1947. Legislators had a term of three years before 2008, which is four afterwards. Meanwhile national assemblymen and members of Control Yuan had a terms of six years. However, due to the loss of the mainland to the Chinese communists, the central public offices could not be put for re-election. To meet the national requirement and to make up the vacancies left for one reason or another, several additional and supplementary elections had been conducted. When the Mobilization Period ended in 1991, the second term of national assemblymen were elected in accordance with the provisions of the Constitution as amended. The election for the second term of legislators were elected for late December 1992.

Local Public Office Elections -- Local elected public offices include Taiwan provincial governer, Taiwan provincial assemblymen, mayers and councilmen at Taipei and Kaohsiung Cities, county (or city) councilmen, county magistrates, and city mayors in Taiwan Province. However, the term of Taiwan Provincial governer and Taiwan provincial assemblymen ended in December 1998.
